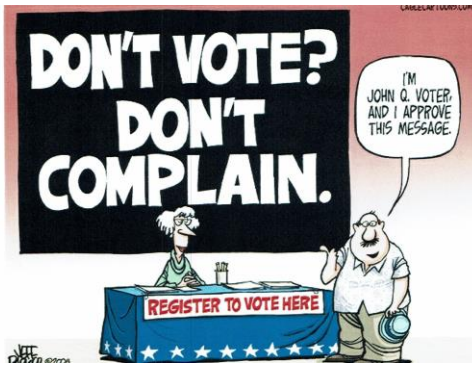


THE BREEZE

RED CONTAINER

- Cardboard (including flattened pizza boxes)
- Envelopes (including envelopes with windows)
- Newspapers (including inserts)
- Paperback books(no hardback books)
- Paperboard (cereal boxes (remove liners), soda boxes, tissue boxes, etc.)
- Shredded paper (place in paper or opaque/clear plastic bags)
- Writing and office paper
- Junk mail
- Magazines, catalogs, phonebooks
- Brown paper bags

PLACE FOOD -CONTAMINATED PAPER/CARDBOARD PRODUCTS IN THE GARBAGE. REMOVE LINER AND FOOD FROM PIZZA BOXES. FLATTEN CARDBOARD BOXES AND CUT DOWN ALL CARDBOARD TO 2 FEET BY 3 FEET.

BLUE CONTAINER

- Aluminum cans/foil trays
- Aerosol cans (empty)
- Metal jar lids
- Milk/juice cartons
- Steel and tin cans and lids
- Glass bottles and jars (all colors)
- Drink boxes

NEW: ALL PLASTICS WITH TRIANGLE SYMBOL NUMBERED #1, #2, #3, #4, #5, AND #7 AND FIT IN THE RECYCLING BIN. NO #6, STYROFOAM. NO PLASTIC BAGS, STYROFOAM PRODUCTS, COAT HANGERS, POTS, PANS, DISHES, PANE GLASS, OR GLASSWARE. LIGHTLY RINSE ALL CONTAINERS NEED A RECYCLING BIN? CALL 493-4100
