Dear South Winds Resident,

Our Annual Meeting was well attended and went smoothly, thanks to the many volunteers and staff that made it so. Regarding the votes on issues before the membership:

- The Rules and Regulations were modified to allow the minimum age of a second person in a Unit to be at least 50 years of age, instead of 55 years of age.
- The title of the By-law Section XIII Budget will be changed to Budget and Financial Report
- We will now have 90 days following the end of the financial year to produce a complete financial report (vs. 60 days).
- We will continue to mail or personally deliver the complete financial report to each member when available.
- The proposal to make our By-law Section, regarding the budget, read as directed by Florida Statute did not achieve the necessary votes to pass (a majority of ALL members), so we will place the issue on the ballot again next year.

The Board of Directors remains the same as last year, since the three incumbents ran unopposed for the three available seats, thus were automatically installed.



# Park Security Ad Hoc Committee Interim Report March 28, 2019

We have been charged with reviewing the park's security needs and to make recommendations regarding individual and Association actions that will enhance the safety and security of our park.

Recently, we had a representative of the Sarasota Sheriff's office talk at a Saturday Coffee Hour about the results of her walk-thru our park, including her recommendations for enhancing security of your home, car, etc. Keeping your car locked, locking your home, when you're away, and your bike, when not in use, keeping plantings around your house trimmed, so there are no hiding spots, etc., things that we all can do to help with crime prevention. If potential thieves don't see anything inviting for them to steal, they'll get the message that "...this place is not easy pickings."

If you have any concerns about a community or an individual, information concerning public safety and domestic security is available on the Florida Department of Law Enforcement web site (www.fdle.state.fl.us). This site allows you to report suspicious activity, to determine whether or not registered sexual offenders and/or predators reside in or near the community and otherwise help to prevent crimes.
